Scholarship 2024

1. The Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association

The Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association is a charitable organization that operates in the Auckland and Waikato regions. The association has operated in various forms as a grower organization since the early 1900s. It represents more than 230 vegetable-growing businesses from the Auckland region. These vary from small family-run businesses to large corporate organizations - some of which have operations throughout New Zealand. These growers produce a large proportion of fresh vegetables for the Auckland region as well as export crops. The exports include onions, potatoes, buttercup squash, capsicums, tomatoes, and carrots.

In 2018 the Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association celebrated its centenary with several events including a Gala Dinner. The gala dinner was a celebration about growers and their contributions to the industry over the past one hundred years. It was, additionally, an insight into the future of growing. To celebrate the event, the Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association announced it has established a fund to help young people entering the vegetable growing industry. This fund is being used to finance the scholarship/s that are now being offered by way of this application form.

2. Objectives

The Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association Scholarships are to assist people in furthering their education in all aspects of horticulture with a particular emphasis on vegetable growing.

3. Value

The amount of the scholarship will vary from year to year depending on the funds available to support it. There is a total fund of \$5,000.00 available as the annual allocated scholarship for payments to a student or split between multiple students in 2024.

4. Payment

This application form for the Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association Scholarship applies to the calendar year 2024. The scholarship amount will be paid out on the successful completion of the year's study – this is a pass mark in all subjects undertaken. Applicants may re-apply for the scholarship in future years to assist with their studies.

5. Eligibility

- 1. Applicants must be either full or part-time students undertaking a horticultural degree, diploma, or certificate or a degree, diploma, or certificate applicable to horticulture taken with a reputable service provider.
- 2. The course of study can be a combination of theory and practical and to award this scholarship is not limited to pure theory courses.
- 3. Applicants must be New Zealand Citizens or Permanent Residents with their family home in the boundaries of the Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association (as set out in paragraph one above).
- 4. There is no age limit, but preference will be given to first-time students.

6. Selection Criteria

The Selection Team will be looking for:

- Commitment and acumen.
- Potential contribution to horticulture with a particular emphasis on vegetable growing.
- Past achievements.

- Individual approach, qualities, and skills; and
- Referees' comments.

The decision of the Selection Team is final, and no correspondence or re-assessment will be entered.

7. Interview process

The interview date is Thursday 05th December 2023 and the interview will be held in Pukekohe at BNZ Partners Centre, Pukekohe. There will be an interview panel of up to four people.

8. Disclosure of Results

If you are successful in receiving a Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association Scholarships by completing this application form, you agree to your academic results being released to the Pukekohe Vegetable Growers Association are very keen to follow your progress.

9. Privacy provisions (Privacy Act 1993):

The information requested in this application form will be used solely to assess your application for the award for which you are applying. By making this application you agree to the Selection Panel contacting your referees and your course supervisor to assess your application.

10. Applications close on Thursday 30th November 2023.

Late applications will not be accepted.
